Approche politique des questions de mobilité

Editorial

Il apparaît que la question des migrations, au même titre que celle de la mobilité, a le plus souvent été conduite dans un cadre qui les associe à un marchandage politico-économique et sécuritaire.

Cette démarche ignore l'aspect humain, interdit toute analyse globale du phénomène et de ses interactions, tout en s'exposant au risque de négliger en grande partie les contraintes des engagements pris dans le cadre des conventions internationales. De plus, elle crée des sources d'instabilité et d'insécurité, tout autant que des drames humains.

Il est recommandé d'approcher la concertation sur les questions de mobilité et de migration sans en faire une variable de compensation ou d'ajustement.

Il semble qu'il soit très difficile en l'état actuel d'adopter une politique migratoire commune partagée par l'ensemble des pays de l'UE et recevable par les pays partenaires. Il convient donc de procéder par une approche pré-communautaire, privilégiant une concertation régionale, notamment en Méditerranée occidentale, débarrassée des approches exclusivement sécuritaire. Elle constituerait de plus un très bon champ d'expérience et renforcerait la solidarité maghrébine.

Il est recommandé, pour définir une politique migratoire, de privilégier une démarche régionale qui, à terme, associée à d'autres approches régionales, pourrait constituer une nouvelle politique euro-méditerranéenne. Une première piste pourrait être de lancer un nouveau « 5+5 migrations ».

La concertation et la coordination en matière d'accompagnement de la mobilité et des migrations imposent inévitablement des efforts de la part des différentes parties concernées. Elles ne peuvent aboutir que si ces efforts s'exercent en vue d'un objectif mobilisateur. Cet objectif doit être clairement perceptible et recevable par la société.

Il est recommandé de lier les démarches de concertation et de coordination sur les questions de mobilité et de migrations à un objectif final valorisant qui pourrait être, à moyen terme, l'accès à un marché commun euro-méditerranéen intégrant la mobilité des personnes .

La plus grande efficacité en matière de traitement des questions de mobilité et de migration ne peut être obtenue que si les différentes parties s'engagent, prenant ainsi en compte les intérêts, les contraintes et les besoins de chacun. La préparation de ces accords pourrait être confiée à une conférence inter gouvernementale régionale des pays concernés pour fixer les règles, les quotas, etc. Elle doit être accompagnée d'un contrôle démocratique, par exemple inter parlementaire, qui entérinerait les conclusions de la conférence.

Il est recommandé, pour le traitement des questions de migration et de mobilité, de mettre en œuvre des accords cogérés impliquant à la fois les gouvernements et la représentation de la population.

DEMOPÆDIA

Demopædia is the modern translation of the series of Multilingual Demographic Dictionaries (translated by scholars and researchers from the original French or English versions into 14 languages). Thanks to the initiative undertaken by Nicolas Brouard, Demopædia has compiled the out-of-print versions of the Dictionaries in different languages and developed a Wiki-based presentation of all of them as a web-accessible Multilingual Demographic Dictionary. The United Nations Population Division, IUSSP and the Comité national français of the IUSSP have all supported this work in order to facilitate access to these valuable reference texts. On the 4th and 5th October 2011, a meeting of the scientific community which is taking care of the Italian version and harmonization of Wikipedia, took place in the Economics faculty of the University of Rome "La Sapienza".



DEMOPÆDIA

In Italy, the Demopædia project is followed by the **Memotef** department of the Economics Faculty. With the strong support of **Nicholas Brouard** and **Joseph Larmarange** the debates during the meeting have been fundamental to organize the future work to further develop the project. The Open Encyclopedia will be opened in a short term period, after the finishing of harmonization process. Conscious of Demopædia's potential in becoming a platform for sharing and building a wider knowledge base in demography and population studies, **Cristina Giudici, Elena Ambrosetti** and other young researchers are working on the project to create Our vision is an extensive and constantly evolving encyclopedia on population, serving the world community and benefiting from influxes of ideas and texts. <http://www.demopædia.org/>




"Dossier Statistico Immigrazione 2011"

The State of World Population 2011

Rome october 20, 2011—Aidos presented the Italian version of the State of World Population 2011, published every year by UNFPA. The Italian edition was presented by Daniela Colombo—Aidos president, Giulia Vallesse—responsible for UNFPA funds and resources, Letizia Mencarini—associate professor in Demography at Università di Torino and Ilaria Venturini Fendi—designer and owner of the firm Carmina Campus which collaborates with Aidos. The 2011 Report is entitled: "The world at 7 billions: people and opportunities" and concentrates on the world's population rising over 7 billions. The volume offers also a photography of demographic situation in Cina, Egypt, Ethiopia, Finland, India, Mexico, Mozambique, Nigeria and Macedonia.



Human Development Report 2011

Since the first days of November, the 2011 Human Development Report published by UNDP is available for downloading. This year's report is entitled "Sustainability and Equity: A Better Future for All" and it majorly concerns world climate change and inequalities issues as a key factor to progress. The report also analyzes the Human Development Index from 187 countries. At the top, the report finds Norway, while at the last place, DR Congo.

The United Nations General Assembly proclaimed **18 December** as **INTERNATIONAL MIGRANTS DAY**, having taken into account the large and increasing number of migrants in the world. This date was chosen because of 18 December 2000, day in which the General Assembly had adopted the International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrant Workers and Members of Their Families.
