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### **Editorial**

The major economic, as well as social and environmental transformations that have taken place in the world in recent decades, have long called for a transformation of the tertiary education and research system. Additionally the latest repercussions of the COVID-19 pandemic on learning opportunities, which have been amplified for the most vulnerable populations, have revealed even more urgency for action towards rethinking the higher education systems.

For years, education has spread only one-way learning, excluding wisdom and ways of interpreting the world which we must now demand to hear, in order to unlock human potential, enrich the debate and walk the path of knowing by abandoning the assumption to know. We are currently witnessing a widening of differences between social classes with an ever decreasing intergenerational social mobility and we cannot continue in this direction. The call is to break down borders in education and realise the central promise of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development: 'Leave no one behind'. The transformative potential of the University must move towards the elimination of all class, social, ethnic and gender barriers and the strengthening of education as a global common good.

There is an urgent obligation to establish a new social contract between political and academic communities to work together for a peaceful and egalitarian world, rediscovering thoughts and actions that value social bonds, collective goods and the ability to share.

The third UNESCO World Higher Education Conference (WHEC2022), held from 18 to 20 May in Barcelona, took place during this challenging time and precisely with this aim in mind. The conference set itself as a crucial event to bring together education actors of varied ages, from many countries and with different roles and experiences to participate united by the common goal of nurturing the dialogue on the topic of higher education and to enhance key proposals for reinventing Higher Education for a Sustainable Future

Throughout the Conference, a strong call has been raised on the articulation of intergovernmental initiatives in favour of higher education and the strengthening of international inter-university collaboration, also through networks, platforms and knowledge management, sharing expertise and coordinating work, in order to multiply opportunities instead of duplicating them.

Particular emphasis should be placed on promoting national and institutional policies and practices to build a global campus for learning, teaching and research and to expand access and international mobility for students from diverse backgrounds. In this regard, there is an urgent need to recognise the specific needs of refugee students, of whom only 5% have access to tertiary education, and to pursue projects aimed at access and retention of those students.

Given the urgency to act and the state of great uncertainty worldwide, the message of the WHEC2022 is to rediscover hope, to work together in our community and around the world to ensure that education best sustains our common future.
